Lute Bapcat Mystery (3 book series)

author Fiction


Joseph Heywood may sound familiar as he authored a very popular 12 book series, the Woods Cop Mysteries. The series follows his character Conservation Officer Grady Service. However, in Red Jacket, Heywood introduces readers to a new Michigan Game Warden Lute Bapcat.

Lute was a sharpshooter in the Spanish-American War serving

under Colonel Theodore Roosevelt. Upon returning to the states after the war, Lute tries cowboying out west, working in underground mines and ends up settling on beaver trapping on the Keweenaw Peninsula in the UP of Michigan. While seeing the beaver numbers dropping, Lute is summoned to a meeting with now U.S. President Theodore Roosevelt. Lute ac-

cepts a new job of "game warden" from Roosevelt in 1913 and has little guidance on what he is supposed to do as a game warden.

A great cast of characters help Bapcat figure out how to enforce the laws, along with the few fish and game regulations of the time. Namely a previous enemy of Bapcat who is a Russian wolf trapper, Zakov, and



the widow Frie, a business woman who has connections across Michigan. But Bapcat hits many roadblocks doing his job, which includes corporate greed from the underground mine owners, starving miners who have gone on strike, and political interference with corrupt sheriff's.

A huge disaster in town which kills men, women and children needs to be solved and Bapcat needs all the help he can get. Red Jacket is a mystery with great history components along with excellent outdoor scene descriptions. Heywood is clearly a professional writer.

Red Jacket has 113 Chapters with 420 pages.


BEHIND A THIN GREEN LINE

to make his covert contact. The case developed rapidly and before you know it,

Tony is riding with the poachers trying to kill elk. Tony details the poaching trips with the poachers and the way he gathered the evidence he needed for a successful prosecution. Tony does a great job adding in the details about his thoughts, worries, risks and accomplishments during the case.

Tony also explains how he kept the suspects straight along with how he determined who killed which elk along with how many each suspect killed. Ballistics and DNA are touched on with the Idaho Fish and Games crime laboratory. The book concludes with the takedown with his team of Idaho Conservation

Officers doing their interviews. Tony also includes a list of the charges and sentences the poachers received.

Behind a Thin Green Line has 37 Chapters with 163 pages.


